June 19-22, 2010

The history of occupational and environmental medicine is rich but has largely been relegated to passing notice or ignored altogether, even by specialists in the field. Brief summaries of occupational and environmental medical history, when they are included in reviews or more rarely still in educational curricula, have a limited focus on the biographical highlights of selected clinicians and researchers who have contributed to the development of this discipline. The 4th International Conference on the History of Occupational and Environmental Health, June 19-22, 2010, has been organized by University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) and by the Scientific Committee on History of Prevention of Occupational and Environmental Diseases of International Commission on Occupational Health (ICOH), with support from that U.S. National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH/CDC) and the Center for Occupational and Environmental Health at the University of California. It will be the first conference held in North America (San Francisco, USA) after the previous events in Europe (Rome, Italy, 1998; Norrköping, Sweden, 2001; and Birmingham, England, 2007). The conference will span three days and includes keynote addresses by international leaders in the field, multiple panel discussions, and original abstract presentations. There will also be a pre course half day history methods workshop covering basic methods, archival research, oral history taking, and biographical studies.

OBJECTIVES

An attendee completing this course will be able to:

- Illustrate the history of occupational and environmental health and its relationship to this field of medicine;
- Demonstrate the widespread nature of certain key exposures such as silica and heavy metals;
- Identify societal factors that impact the practice of occupational health;
- Describe emerging occupational and environmental issues from an international, population health perspective.
